STIPULATION AND
CONSENT ORDER
Board File 2008-091

It is hereby stipulated and agreed by Daniel James Skrypek ("Respondent"), 13457 Dellwood Way, Rosemount, MN 55068 and the Complaint Committee ("Committee") of the Board of Accountancy ("Board") that without trial or adjudication of any issue of fact or law and without any evidence or admission by any party with respect to any such issue:

1. A Notice of Conference with the Board of Accountancy's Complaint committee was duly served upon Respondent, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by Respondent.
2. On July 21, 2008, Respondent appeared before the Board's Complaint Committee to discuss allegations made in the notice referenced above. Executive Director, Doreen Frost and Board Investigator, Steven Renville were also present. Gregory P. Huwe, Assistant Attorney General, represented the Board at the conference. Respondent was not represented by legal counsel at the conference.
3. For the purpose of this stipulation, Respondent waives all procedures and proceedings before the Board to which Respondent may be entitled under the United States and Minnesota constitutions, statutes, or the rules of the Board, including the right to dispute the allegations against Respondent and to dispute the appropriateness of discipline, in a contested case hearing pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 14 (2008). Respondent agrees that upon the ex parte application of the Committee, the Board may order the remedy specified in paragraph 9 below. Respondent waives the right to any judicial review of the order by appeal, by writ of certiorari, or otherwise. Although Respondent was reminded of his right to counsel, he voluntarily waived such right stating that he understood his right.
4. This Stipulation shall constitute the entire record of the proceedings herein upon which the Consent Order is based. All documents in the Board's files shall maintain the data classification to which they are entitled under the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn.

Stat. § 13 (2008). To the extent they are not already public documents, they shall not become public merely because they are referenced herein.

5. In the event the Board in its discretion does not approve this Stipulation or a lesser remedy than specified in this Consent Order, this Stipulation and Consent Order shall be null and void and shall not be used for any purpose by either party. If this Stipulation is not approved and a contested case hearing is initiated by the Committee pursuant to Minn. Stat. ch. 14 (2008), Respondent agrees not to object to the Board's initiation of the hearing or its final decision and order in the case on the basis that the Board has become disqualified because of to its review and consideration of this Stipulation or of any records relating hereto.

FACTS

6. Respondent admits the facts referred to below and grants that the Board may, for the purpose of reviewing the record as provided in paragraph 4 above, consider the following as true without prejudice to the Respondent in any current or future proceeding of the Board with regard to these or other allegations:

a. On October 31, 2007, Respondent consented to entry of final judgment in United States Securities and Exchange Commission v. Greg A. Gadel and Daniel J. Skrypek, C. A. No. 06-cv-2320, United States District Court, District of Minnesota. The complaint of the United States Securities and Exchange Commission ("Commission") in the above matter was based on alleged understatements of executive compensation, undisclosed related-party transactions, and improper capitalization of assets for the purpose of overstating pre-tax income in the financial statements and proxy statements of Buca, Inc., prepared and filed with the Commission during 2000-2004, when Respondent was controller of the corporation. Final judgment in the above matter was entered on or about December 21, 2007.

b. Pursuant to the consent to entry of final judgment and final judgment, Respondent was permanently enjoined and restrained from violating provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934; enjoined for a period of five years from acting as a director or officer of any issuer of registered securities or that is required to file reports under the Exchange Act; and ordered to pay civil penalties of \$50,000.

c. Based on the above, Respondent has committed unprofessional acts resulting in Respondent's right to practice before any federal, state, or other government agency revoked, suspended, canceled, limited, or not renewed for cause, or has committed unprofessional acts for which the person or firm was otherwise disciplined or sanctioned, including, but not limited to, being ordered to or agreeing to cease and desist from prescribed conduct.

d. Based on the above, Respondent violated Minnesota Statutes § 326A.08 Subd. 5 (a) (2), (3), (7) & (10).

e. Respondent failed to renew his certificate for the years 2006, 2007 and 2008, in violation of Minn. Stat. § 326A.04, subd. 2 (2008).

STATUTES

7. Respondent admits that the facts and conduct specified in paragraph 4 above constitute violations of Minn. Stat. § 326A (2008) and Minnesota Rules chapter 1105 (2007), and are sufficient grounds for the remedy specified in paragraph 9 below, and that proof at hearing of any one or more of the allegations set forth would empower the Board to take disciplinary action against Respondent's certificate.

8. This Stipulation shall not in any way or manner limit or affect the authority of the Board to proceed against Respondent by initiating a contested case hearing or by other appropriate means on the basis of any act, conduct, or admission of Respondent justifying disciplinary action which occurred before or after the date of this stipulation and that is not directly related to the specific facts and circumstances set forth herein.

REMEDY

9. Upon this Stipulation and record as set forth in paragraph 4 and 6 above, and without any further notice of proceedings, the Committee and Respondent agree that the Board may, in its discretion, issue an order to Respondent requiring compliance with the following:

a. Respondent's certificate is **CENSURED** and **REPRIMANDED**.

b. Concurrent with the submission of this Stipulation and Consent Order to the Board for its approval Respondent shall pay a total of \$2,180 for the following:

- 1) A CIVIL PENALTY of \$2,000.
- 2) \$30 Inactive Certificate renewal fees, and
- 3) \$150 delinquency fees for the years 2006, 2007 and 2008.

c. Respondent shall successfully complete and report to the Board eight hours of continuing professional education in the subject of professional ethics for the years ending June 30, 2006, 2007 and 2008. ~~by October~~ 31, 2008. Failure to successfully complete and report to the Board the required hours by the date specified shall be a violation of the Board's order and shall result in the automatic suspension of the Respondent's certificate until the hours are reported to the Board and the Board acknowledges receipt of the hours. The hours required shall be in addition to the continuing professional education hours required by Minnesota Rules 1105.3000 (2007).

d. Concurrent with the submission of this Stipulation and Consent Order to the Board for its approval, Respondent shall apply for an inactive certificate. Respondent shall not engage in activities requiring an active certificate in this state, including but not limited to the performance of attest services, nor shall Respondent hold out to the public in any manner that suggests or implies that the Respondent holds an active certificate. Respondent shall comply with Minnesota Statutes section 326A.04, subd 4.

e. Respondent agrees that the Respondent will not violate in the future any statute, rule or order that the Board has issued or is empowered to enforce.

10. In accordance with Minn. Stat. § 16D.17 (2008), in the event this order becomes final and Respondent does not comply with the condition in paragraph 9(b) above, Respondent agrees that the Board may file and enforce the unpaid portion of the civil penalty as a judgment with out further notice or additional proceedings.

11. Violations of this Stipulation and Consent Order shall be considered a violation of Minn. Stat. § 326A.08, subd 5 (1) (2008). If Respondent violates this Stipulation and Consent Order,

Minn. Stat. §§ 326A.01-.14 (2008) or Minn. Rules 1105 (2007), the Board may impose additional discipline pursuant to the following procedure:

a. The Complaint Committee shall schedule a hearing before the Board. At least ten days prior to the hearing, the Committee shall mail Respondent a notice of the violation alleged by the Committee and of the time and place of the hearing. Service of notice on Respondent is complete upon mailing the notice to Respondent's last known address. Within seven days after the notice is mailed, Respondent shall submit a response to the allegations. If Respondent does not submit a timely response to the Board, the allegations may be deemed admitted.

b. At the hearing before the Board, the Committee and Respondent may submit affidavits made on personal knowledge and argument based on the record in support of their positions. The evidentiary record before the Board shall be limited to such affidavits and this Stipulation and Consent Order. Respondent waives a hearing before an administrative law judge and waives discovery, cross-examination of adverse witnesses, and other procedures governing administrative hearings or civil trials.

c. At the hearing, the Board will determine whether to impose additional disciplinary action, which may include additional conditions or limitations on Respondent's practice or suspension or revocation of Respondent's certificate.

The Committee shall have the right to attempt to resolve an alleged violation of the Stipulation and Consent Order through the procedures of Minn. Stat. § 214.10 (2008). Nothing herein shall limit (a) the Committee's right to initiate a proceeding against Respondent pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 14 (2008), or (b) the Committee's and the Board's right to temporarily suspend Respondent's certificate pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 326A.08, subd. 6 (2008), based on a violation of this Stipulation and Consent Order or based on conduct of Respondent before or after the date of this stipulation which is not specifically referred to in paragraph 6 above.

12. Any appropriate court may, upon application of the Board, enter its decree enforcing the order of the Board.

13. Respondent hereby acknowledges that he has read, understands, and agrees to this Stipulation and Consent Order and has freely and voluntarily signed the stipulation without threat or promise by the Board or any of its members, employees, or agents. When signing the stipulation, Respondent acknowledges that he is fully aware that the Stipulation and Consent Order must be approved by the Board. The Board may approve the Stipulation and Consent Order as proposed, approve the order subject to specified change, or reject it. If the changes are unacceptable to Respondent or the Board rejects the stipulation, it will be of no effect except as specified herein.

14. This Stipulation and Consent Order is public data pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 13.41, subdivision 4 (2008).

15. This Stipulation contains the entire agreement between the parties. Respondent is not relying on any other agreement or representation of any kind, verbal or otherwise.

16. If approved by the Board, a copy of this Stipulation and Consent Order shall be served personally or by first class mail on Respondent. The Order shall be effective and deemed issued when it is signed.
