REINSTATEMENT ORDER

The Minnesota Board of Accountancy has determined as follows:

1. The Board is authorized to license and regulate certified public accountants pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 326A.01-.14 (2024).

2. The Board issued Respondent Dexi Zheng a certified public accountant certificate on July 15, 2013.

3. Effective October 24, 2017, the Board issued Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order, which suspended Zheng's certificate for eight years and imposed multiple conditions that must be met before he could reinstate his certificate.

4. On April 1, 2026, Zheng petitioned to reinstate his suspended certificate. Zheng's petition included evidence of eligibility for reinstatement, as well as letters of reference and support from current and former employers.

5. On June 4, 2026, Zheng appeared before the Board with counsel to discuss and answer questions about his reinstatement petition, the conditions that were imposed when his certificate was suspended, his current employment, and future plans.

6. This order is in the public interest.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 326A.09, that Zheng's certified public accountant certificate may be reinstated to the active status upon submission of the \$100 renewal fee and subject to the following conditions:

A. Zheng shall continue to make restitution payments in accordance with any repayment schedules set by the United States Department of Justice.


B. Zheng shall remain law abiding of both Federal and State laws and comply with all statutes and rules within the Board's jurisdiction. See Minn. Stat. ch. 326A (2024) and Minn. R. ch. 1105 (2025)

Zheng shall self-report to the Board in writing and within 30 days if he fails to meet or comply with either condition imposed by this order. Zheng's failure to comply with either condition or failure to timely self-report noncompliance to the Board shall, subject to the Board's discretion, constitute grounds for disciplinary action following a hearing conducted in accordance with chapter 14.

This order shall be classified as public data pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 13.41, subd. 5 (2024).
