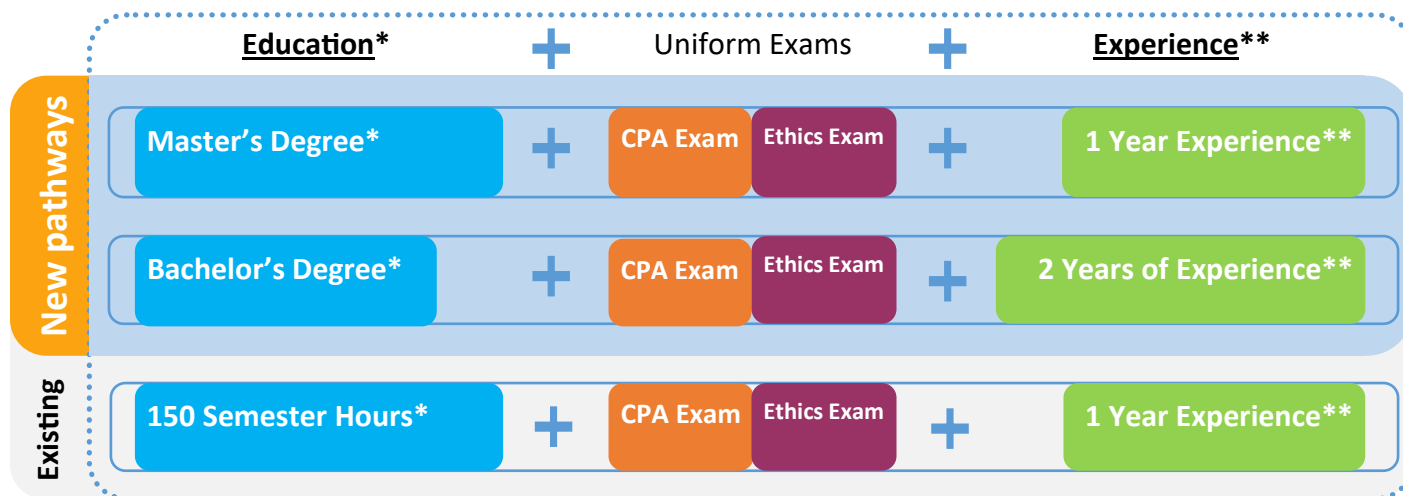


NEW PATHWAYS TO CPA LICENSURE

Recent legislation adds two new “pathways” to becoming a CPA. As of **January 1, 2026**, candidates can qualify for licensure with one of the following combinations of education plus experience.



*Note: Education Requirements

Depending on your program’s accreditation and the level of your degree, you may also need to meet specific coursework requirements, such as:

- 24 semester hours in accounting (“Acct”) subjects, including a course in each:
 - ◇ Auditing or Attest ◇ Financial Acct
 - ◇ Taxation ◇ Mgmt or Cost Acct
- And 24 semester hours in business-related subjects.

**Note: Experience Requirements

Acceptable experience includes providing any type of service or advice using accounting, attest, compilation, management advisory, financial advisory, tax, or consulting skills.

Experience must be verified by a licensee with **first-hand knowledge** of the experience who either:

- (1) holds a valid CPA certificate or an unexpired Inactive certificate in Minnesota **OR**
- (2) holds an unexpired certificate, license, or registration in another state.
